## REGION 6 Annual Convention

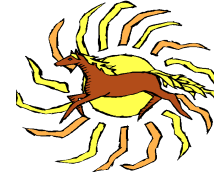

### Update on West Nile virus in Horses

Many horse owners are aware of the dangers of West Nile virus (WNV) as it relates to horse health. For those that are now being introduced, this is a vector (insect)-born viral disease that is transmitted by mosquitoes to horses. Disease associated with WNV infections has been primarily recognized in the United States in birds, humans and horses. Evidence of exposure to the virus has been documented in other species of animals, but occurrence of disease thus far has been rarely recognized. While birds are the primary reservoir host for WNV, the principal vectors are a variety of mosquito species. Mosquitoes are responsible for transmission among birds, as well as from birds to incidental (sometimes called dead-end) hosts such as humans and horses. Unlike WNV in various bird species, the virus does not amplify sufficiently in infected horses and humans to infect mosquitoes and allow spread to other susceptible hosts. A wide range of bird species have been recognized to be infected with WNV, but severe illness and death has been primarily recognized in the U.S. in the corvid species (blue jays, crows, and ravens)<sup>a</sup>.

Horses are quite sensitive to the ill effects of disease, represented by outbreaks observed across the country since the summer of 1999. Currently, at the time of this writing, disease associated with West Nile virus has been observed in all of the continental United States except for Washington and Oregon.

Typical clinical signs in horses include muscle fasciculation or “quivering” of the muzzle and head, as well as fasciculations in other regions of the body. Depression, reduced food intake, and pronounced sleepiness have also been observed. Some horses develop an abnormal gait, demonstrating incoordination

(ataxia) represented by stumbling, tripping, and uneven stride length, or in some cases horses become recumbent, demonstrating an inability to rise.

As horse owners, the best plan is to implement preventative strategies to avoid the development of disease. Actions that will reduce the likelihood of disease are environmental control of mosquito breeding areas (eliminate free-standing water), avoid pasture turnout during dusk and dawn, current WNV vaccination of all horses and monitoring for any changes in condition or demeanor. Vaccination strategies will vary depending on geography, but the currently licensed killed-WNV vaccine<sup>b</sup> should be administered, by your veterinarian, every 4 to 5 months during seasons of warm weather.

If a horse is demonstrating clinical signs consistent with WNV-associated encephalitis (brain inflammation); calling your local veterinarian is the best plan. Treatments that have been used to manage these horses involve the use of anti-inflammatory therapy, drugs that enhance the horses own immune response, and in some cases WNV-specific serum or plasma administration is necessary. A goal of veterinary treatment is excellent supportive care to maintain adequate nutrient and water/fluid intake. Specific drugs that are chosen will depend on the severity of disease and current vaccination status.

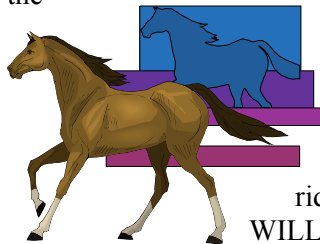
