2008 RIDE BOOK - CORRECTIONS/CHANGES

There is an error in the ride book involving the Kanopolis Region 6 Benefit Ride. The ride book states that you can call the State Park to make a reservation for a campsite, pay a reservation fee in advance, and pay the rest of the camping fees when you arrive. The Park has notified us that **all** camp fees must be paid in advance in order to make a reservation. Also, please keep in mind that your annual Kansas park permit may be purchased at a discount prior to April 1, 2008.

In addition, the Rustlers & Renegades Roundup Ride at Big Hill, May 17-18, has been cancelled.

INSURANCE MESSAGE FROM NATRC EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

I have been talking with Diane Lesher at Equisure. The age limit for NATRC's Accident policy is now 75. Under our accident medical policy, the policy provisions limit the coverage to age 12 to 75. Folks over 75 would need to rely on their personal insurance. I know we hate to lose a volunteer, but if they would prefer not to rely on their own insurance, then they should not volunteer.

Keep in mind that we are one of the few organizations that actually offer an accident policy to our volunteers. We are fortunate to have that coverage. In many horse activities, the volunteers are on their own for insurance, regardless of age.

NATRC has two policies:

- 1) The event liability policy covers third party bodily injury and property damage. Those covered under the policy are NATRC, the event manager, the committee members, officials and event landowners (that have been added by written request). There is no age limit - it is to defend those covered under the policy for something they may be negligent or legally liable for.
- The accident medical policy covers volunteers and officials age (12 to 75) for accidental bodily injury resulting in death or disablement while at a covered event (a ride).

Hope this clarifies things a bit.

NATRC STUDENT LOAN PROGRAM

Student loans are available up to \$5,000 per person per year, at the discretion of the National Board of Directors, after proper application has been submitted. For an application, contact the NATRC Executive Administrator at natrc@natrc.org. Please complete the form in Word 2003 and submit via email to the NATRC Executive Administrator at natrc@natrc.org.

Preference will be given to a full-time student who has been a member of NATRC or whose family has been an active member for at least three years. Consideration will also be given to a student or a student's family who has been an active member of NATRC for less than three years but more than six months. A loan will be made based upon financial need, scholastic achievement, and character of the applicant as determined by the Student Loan/ Scholarship Committee.

The loan is to be repaid in monthly installments beginning not later than six months following graduation or when the recipient ceases to be a full-time student. An annual interest rate of 3% will be charged starting at graduation or when the recipient ceases to be a full-time student.
