Judges Committee News

There may be confusion regarding the proper procedure for counting respiration rates.

The number that is recorded on the P&R card and then transferred to the

horse card is the number of breaths (inspiration/expiration cycles) counted in one 15 second interval. There are no exemptions for any reason including breed of horse, weather factors, or

rate of respiration, e.g. "panting". Specifically, if a horse is "panting", the 15 second count is **NOT** divided by 4 to find the recordable respiration rate.

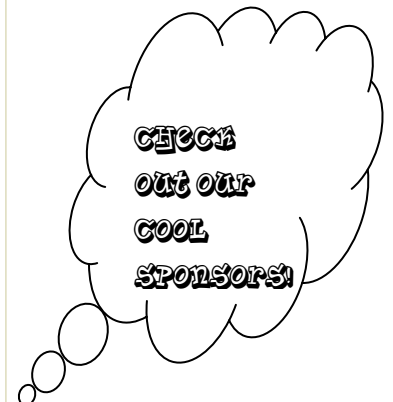

Logo and Letterhead Branding Approved

In an effort to provide cohesiveness and instant recognition, the marketing committee submitted to the national board, for approval, standardized logos and letterheads. The board has approved the recommendation. In summary:

- ☞ The horse and rider should always be facing left, traveling uphill.
- ☞ The logo should always be positioned in the upper right hand corner.
- ☞ The words North American Trail Ride Conference should be flush right to the logo.
- ☞ The outline of North America should be omitted from all logos.
- ☞ The words (in a circle) may be included in the logo or the horse/rider may be used alone.
- ☞ If applicable, a dark cobalt blue should be used for all headings and logos.
- ☞ When appropriate, comic sans font should be used. However, when used in official business documents, the font should be Arial.
- ☞ Only the newsletter editor may change the font used, using a style of print that suits the layout of the newsletter.

In the near future, anyone can go to the national website and download the appropriate heading. The marketing committee will let each region know when these are available.

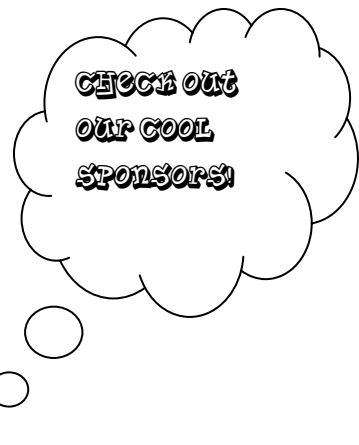

Jim Menefee Honorary Lifetime Membership (HLM)

Each region may nominate one member of NATRC for the JM Honorary Lifetime Membership award. At the final board meeting, the National Board will select one recipient with the award being presented at the following National Convention. Nomination letter to be limited to 400 words. **This award is not related in content to the Jim Menefee Memorial Combined Horse/Horsemanship award.*

Workers Hall of Fame

Each region may nominate one member of NATRC for the Workers Hall of Fame. At the final National Board meeting, the board will select one or more recipients at their discretion. Recipients may be individual or pairs. The award is presented at the following National Convention. Nomination letter to be limited to 400 words.

National Appreciation Awards

Each region may nominate one member for a National Appreciation Award. At the final National Board meeting, the board will select three (3) recipients who will be presented at the next National Convention. A recipient can be eligible only once every three years.

Nomination letter to be limited to 200 words.

Regional Appreciation Awards for National Recognition

Each region may select up to three (3) recipients for national recognition. These recipients will be presented to the board at the final National Board meeting, and appreciation certificates will be presented at the following National Convention. Recipients may be individuals or pairs or groups such as ride sponsors or clubs. Nomination letter to be limited to 200 words.

BY-LAWS CHANGES and TERM LIMITS

To: NATRC Members

At its July Board meeting in Denver last weekend, the National Board of Directors voted on three proposed By-Law changes that had been presented to the membership in a written ballot earlier in the year. By-Law changes require a simple majority vote by the membership, but also a 2/3 majority of the National Directors' votes to change.

Two of the By-Laws were passed by 2/3 of the National Directors consistent with the majority ruling of the membership; therefore, elections for National Directors will be held at the regional level and Directors appointed to fill vacancies will fill the vacancies for the remainder of the existing term of the vacancy.

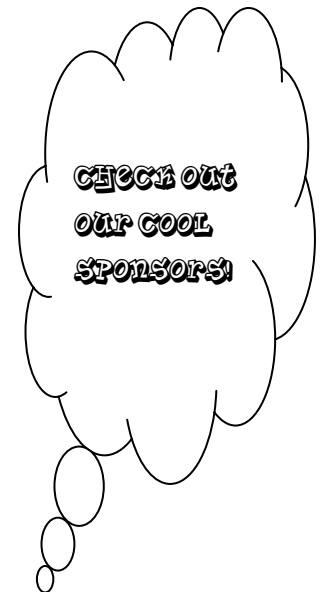
The By-Law to impose Term Limits of two consecutive terms for National Directors was narrowly passed by the membership, with half for and half against term limits. The NBOD voting process was careful and considered. A document summarizing the pros and cons of the issue was sent to the Board in advance of the meeting with ensuing e-mail discussion leading to the meeting. A vote was taken by show of hands and duly recorded. The National Director vote was 6-6 which accurately reflected the vote of the membership, so the proposed change does not take effect.

Fifty years ago the founding members of NATRC put in place procedures to insure that the foundation documents of our organization cannot be altered without considerable thought and agreement. In the case of these three proposed changes, the process worked with great deliberation and effort expended by the membership and leadership to examine all aspects of the issues. Thank you for participating in this process and the ones to come in the future.

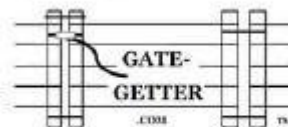

Membership Goals: We're almost there!

After the 2010 ride season, the national board of directors established some new goals regarding desired regional membership totals for 2011. As of June 2011, Region 6 is close to achieving the goal of 164 regional members. We currently have 156 members so we are 8 members out. Only one region, Region 4 has met the regional goal so come on Region 6 – let's get out there and recruit 8 more members. We can do this!

News from the National Board of Directors

Jerry and I just returned from the July meeting of NATRCs National Board of Directors. Here's a summary of what we accomplished.

- ☞ The following rule changes will be sent out to the membership for voting.
 1. Headgear with attached reins is now required.
 2. New lifetime memberships will no longer be issued.
 3. Instead of Family Memberships, it will now read Household Memberships.
- ☞ National Board of Directors voted on three proposed By-Law changes that had been presented to the membership in a written ballot earlier in the year. By-Law changes require a simple majority vote by the membership, but also a 2/3 majority of the National Directors' votes to change.
- ☞ Two of the By-Laws were passed by 2/3 of the National Directors consistent with the majority ruling of the membership; therefore, elections for National Directors will be held at the regional level and Directors appointed to fill vacancies will fill the vacancies for the remainder of the existing term of the vacancy.
- ☞ The By-Law to impose Term Limits of two consecutive terms for National Directors was narrowly passed by the membership The National Director vote was 6-6 which is not the required 2/3 vote and so did not pass.
- ☞ The Media Advisory board recommended that the *Hoofprint* be distributed by electronic email beginning with the December issue. NBOD voted in favor of this recommendation.
- ☞ Every Region 6 member will receive a copy of the other regional newsletters.
- ☞ NATRC is excited to announce that a horseback riding vacation to Machu Picchu, Peru, will be raffled off at the 2012 national convention. Details can be found in the corresponding article in this newsletter.
- ☞ The NBOD is still focused on making financial decisions that will impact the future of NATRC. This isn't an easy task but the board is dedicated to the survival of our sport.

*Footnote: I must admit that I actually laughed at a joke Jerry Weil made during the meeting because the joke was actually funny. I know... I'm still in shock.

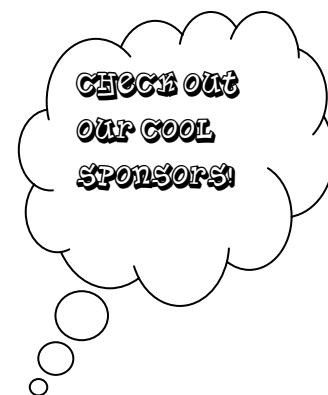

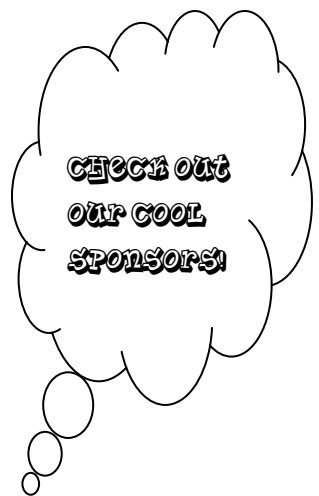

The Saga of Ruthie

In July, Jackie Hathorn posted that Ruth Mesimer was in a serious horse riding accident and was in ICU at North KC Hospital. Ruth suffered a broken hip, a hairline fracture on a vertebra and a concussion. Ruth was found by a neighbor after they noticed a saddled horse with no rider around. Ruth did not remember what happened and they are unsure of how much time elapsed between the accident and when she was found. Ruth was wearing a helmet.

Fortunately Ruth is recovering and says:

Monday, July 18, I was released from the rehab unit at NKC Hospital. As I was wheeling myself out in a wheelchair with a CNA in attendance with a cart of my stuff, I was smiling from ear to ear and saying 'Oh, happy day' over and over. Home health started on Tuesday with a nurse and PT. I am doing great! Thanks to your cards and continued prayers and support. I am very grateful. My good friend Janet is taking care of me in her home; I have plenty of good food to eat and help getting outside to exercise. It was great to get to ride in a vehicle and see the changes in my neck of the woods during the past 3 weeks. My home place looked great to see and it was heaven to get to Janet's. I am remembering to hold my head up, shoulders back, tummy in (same as riding). Muscles in left leg are improving and PT is working with me to be as ready as I can be to walk when the orthopedist changes my status from non-weight bearing to the next step.

Orthopedic appointment Aug 9 and Neurologist appointment Aug 23 - c collar stays on until Neurologist says otherwise. Will update later when more progress has been made.

August 11, 2011, Hi all, I am now starting to bear weight on my left leg. Very odd, after all this time, learning how to walk again (instead of hopping) with the support of my walker. I did accomplish an advanced 'observation' today, I 'walked' up and then down 6 steps using the banister and one crutch! I have my exercises to do to strengthen the leg muscles and work on walking heel to toe. Next PT is on Tuesday, I hope I am walking better by then!

September 7, 2011, I'm home! Good morning Region 6'ers,

A quick update – It has been 10 weeks since my accident - I have now spent 1 full day and 2 nights in my home. Feels good and different! Now to get back to business as usual! I can now feed the chickens and cats (outside walking stuff), dog inside feeding and I am good at heating up prepared food. Grocery stores – haven't been there yet, but I think the motorized cart will be the way to go. I am walking forwards, backwards and sideways without a crutch or a cane. I say I am in my toddler walking phase right now, but getting stronger and better each day. I do need to take frequent breaks, but that is okay, making progress!

Thank you for your cards, emails, prayers and phone calls – they have been a big help during this 10 weeks.

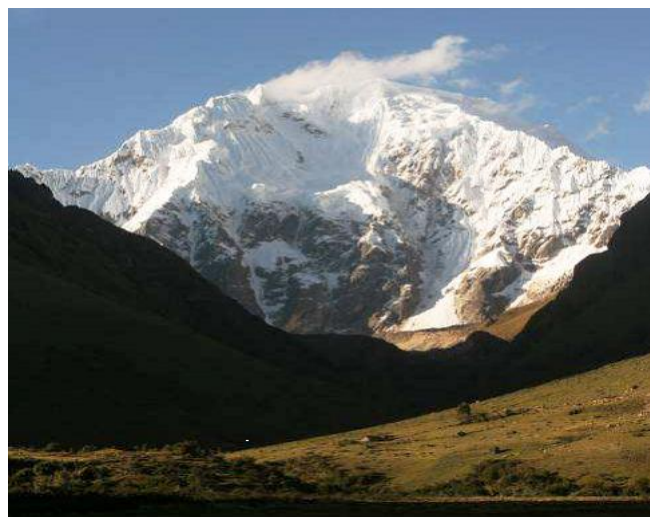

My first horse was Belle, a TWH, in eastern North Carolina. I was 10 years old, ecstatic to finally have a real horse and invited friend after friend to ride with me. How I wish someone at a rodeo, horse show, parade, feed store, extension meeting, vet clinic, saddle shop, ball game, track meet, grocery store, swimming pool, garage sale...SOMEWHERE I was all those years, had been wearing a NATRC visor or T-shirt, something that would have prompted a question from me, "What is NATRC?"
