**PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE**

Priscilla Lindsey

A review of the NATRC national Board of Directors' meeting, November, 2012:

- Executive Administrators Report: A storage unit had been rented to protect NATRC files and materials from possible fire danger this summer in Colorado. *BOD approved continuing rent of unit to house materials, as well as continuing rent to EA for rest of materials and office space.*
- Rules: See report with those approved/rejected.
- Policies and Procedures: 1) Approved wording change for Jim Menefee Honorary Lifetime Membership to Jim Menefee NATRC Lifetime Achievement Award. 2) Approved changing "Chairman" to "Chair" in Rule book to reflect as gender neutral. 3) Our bylaws mention an annual meeting of the membership, but we haven't actually been having one. Approved to now have an annual meeting every year at Convention. 4) Confirmed that electronic meetings are consistent with our bylaws, and approved further exploration into the use of these meetings for the NBOD and related committees.
- Kim Cowart and Elaine Swiss will continue to go forward with exploration of a planned giving and Estate Planning program. Elaine has experience in this endeavor and will guide the efforts. Although Kim had initially suggested a 2013 roll out of the programs Elaine has convinced us that more in-depth planning is needed for a successful fundraising campaign. The target now is 2014.
- Safety: We are reminded NOT to use juniors as our safety riders. Too many liability concerns as well as practical ones. For those rides that have trouble recruiting safety riders we discussed alternatives such as ATV use and checkpoints that the safety riders can get to and wait on the riders to come by , thus verifying all are accounted for.
- Marketing/Publicity: We want to encourage more use of E-News. We are asking Bev Roberts to work towards the advertising of all our rides on E-News.
- Raffle: Tickets available for this year's "Choice of three raffle". Next year's raffle will be a choice of 5 ranch/horse vacations. The first winner drawn will get first choice of the five;
- Trail Advocacy: Erin Glassman continues to do a great job for us. NBOD approved \$500.00 reimbursement to Erin for 2012 SETC.
- Membership: Betty Wolgram suggested various incentive possibilities to encourage early renewal of membership---discounts, etc...
- Judges: Natalie Goldberger, Reg 4 approved Veterinary Card. Jerry Sims, Reg 3 approved for Horsemanship card. Becky Rogers, Reg 4 approved to move to provisional Horsemanship.
- Scholarship: \$750.00 available/can consider up to \$5000.00 (if the NBOD approves the use of principal from the Student Loan fund).
- Honorary and Appreciation: Approved Regional and National appreciation as sent in per Region. Jean Green, Region 4, voted Jim Menefee NATRC Lifetime Achievement Award.
- Convention 2013 in Aurora, Colorado at DoubleTree Hotel, Feb. 21,22,23. Theme is "The Big Picture". Convention 2014 will be hosted by Region 4 in Tulsa, OK.

- Officers elected for 2013: President, Kim Cowart; Vice-President, Lory Walls; Treasurer, Elaine Swiss.

\*\*\*\*Friday night informal meeting: The theme of this meeting was to discuss a comparison of NATRC and AERC---the two premier distance riding organizations in the United States. Although AERC has many of the same problems as NATRC, including declining memberships, they are still able to draw more numbers than NATRC. We discussed possible lessons we could learn from AERC. The recurring thought was that NATRC must be “Flexible” in its thinking and consideration of tactics in recruiting/retaining riders and members. Some of the ideas included more one-day rides (including multiple one-day rides back-to-back on the same weekend); changing DO restrictions; making management issues less restrictive and more stream-lined; heavy emphasis on local thinking---local attendance, etc...; making the final vet exam quicker to ease that dreaded wait time at the end of the ride; recruitment of more local judges to ease financial burden on ride managers incurred from flying in judges.

Another part of the discussion was about the perception that NATRC has too many rules, when in fact what we really have are “expectations” of good horsemanship. Examples are: staying with Vet judge at exam, not putting fingers in halter ring, safe stabling, etc... etc... These are all examples of the good horsemanship we encourage and expect from our riders, but to a newcomer they can be confused with rules. We should stress that it is, in fact, a good thing to expect good horsemanship.

**Proposed Rule Changes (in bold)**  
**Results of Voting at NBOD November, 2012**

**1. Section 2A.5.f.** (page 2-2) reads:

f. To maintain sanctioned ride status:

- (1) A ride must be listed in Hoof Print with the correct date at least once.
- (2) Entry forms must be pre-approved by Sanction Chairman before mailing to members

Change to read:

- (1) A ride must be listed **on the NATRC official web site (with the correct ride date) at least 60 days prior to the ride.**

*Purpose: To correct an error in the Rule Book. The Hoof Print is no longer published often enough for ride managers to abide by the present wording. **APPROVED***

**2. Section 5 I.4.** (page 5-3) reads:

4. Riders must remain in the saddle when the horse is in forward motion over the course but may dismount and rest themselves and the horse anytime, provided they do not advance. At any location designated by the trailmaster as hazardous, riders may be instructed to dismount and proceed on foot for a specified distance.

Change to read:

4. Riders must remain in the saddle when the horse is in forward motion over the course but may dismount and rest themselves and the horse anytime, provided they do not advance. At any location designated by the trailmaster, **ride manager, or judges** as hazardous, riders may be instructed to dismount and proceed on foot for a specified distance.

*Purpose: To correct the Rule Book since this is often presently done on rides. **APPROVED***

**3. Section 10 B.2.a.** (page 10-1) reads:

- a. National Championship – In Open Division in heavyweight, lightweight and junior classes a horse shall be declared a National Champion when both of the following requirements are met within any three- year period in which rides are held.

Change to read:

- a. National Championship – In Open Division in heavyweight, lightweight and junior classes a horse shall be declared a National Champion when both of the following requirements are met within any **consecutive** three-year period in which rides are held.

*Purpose: To clarify the three-year period must be consecutive. Note- this is only for Region 1A (Alaska) **APPROVED***

**4. Section 5 B.4.** (page 5-1) reads:

4. Stabling Options **Not Allowed** during competition as primary containment:
  - a. Hobbling of any kind
  - b. Portable pens/corrals
  - c. Staking out in any manner

Changed to read:

4. Stabling Options **Not Allowed** during competition as primary containment:
  - a. Hobbling of any kind
  - b. Portable pens/corrals panels that are not securely anchored to a trailer or a tree**
  - ~~c. Portable pens that are constructed of Electric fencing or are flimsy in~~

~~nature (examples of approved corrals are Carrilite, Preifert or equivalent panels).~~

d. Staking out in any manner.

*Purpose: to provide the use of certain types of portable corrals/panels.* **APPROVED**

**6. Section 6. B.1.** (page 6-1) reads:

1. Condition 40%: The evaluation of condition shall include, but not be limited to, the following: fatigue, P&R recovery, attitude and willingness, muscle soreness, mucous membrane, azoturia, thumps, hydration and capillary refill, bowel sounds, colic, respiration character, sweat and salivation, coordination, eating and drinking, etc.

Change to read:

1. Condition 40%: The evaluation of condition shall include, but not be limited to, the following: fatigue, P&R recovery, **CRI (cardiac recovery index)**, attitude and willingness, muscle soreness, mucous membrane, **myoglobinuria**, thumps, hydration and capillary refill, bowel sounds, colic, respiration character, sweat and salivation, coordination, eating and drinking, etc.

*Purpose: to include the ability to use CRI (cardiac recovery index) in the evaluation of condition and correct terminology (myoglobinuria instead of azoturia).* **REJECTED BECAUSE OF WORDING ISSUES--SHALL VS. MAY IN FIRST SENTENCE.**

The **APPROVED** rule changes go into effect for the 2013 ride year.

### **Notes from Alycia Carlsborg about her accident at the Dave Smith Fall Fiesta, Sept. 15, 2012**

Thank you to all the ITRA and NATRC members who sent messages or visited bringing books and magazines.

Two hours into the Dave Smith Fall Fiesta CTR, my new horse, Magic, and I started down what appeared to be a pleasant, wide, downhill trail. Suddenly I spotted a long gray pointed tree branch positioned to poke into Magic's flank right behind my right leg. When the branch poked Magic, she gave a buck, and I broke 6 ribs and damaged some vertebrae. I was wearing a helmet and landed on about three inches of mud so there was no head or neck injury. (At our ITRA Annual Meeting, Betty Grim reported that she heard the branch crack when it jabbed into Magic.)

Safety Riders, Teresa Harp, Mary Doyle and Diana Thrift were promptly there to assist me. Due to the convenience of my cell phone, I was immediately able to phone my husband, Les, and cut short his fishing trip on Hickory Grove Lake. (He was in his boat.). Teresa entered Les's phone number on her cell phone and kept him informed of my whereabouts while he was changing his plans and traveling to Fort Dodge Trinity Regional Medical Center. Teresa also kindly volunteered to drive my truck, trailer and horse to our home in Ames on Sunday after the CTR was over.

- Sept. 15-20: Taken to University of Iowa Hospital where I was measured for a clam-shell brace. (Some of my old injuries confused the reading of X-rays at Ft. Dodge. At the University of Iowa Hospital, they determined I wasn't as critical as they thought, and I quote: "Have you had an injury before?" Maybe someone should have asked me that in Ft. Dodge when I questioned the need to go to the University of Iowa Hospital.

- Sept. 20-Oct. 9: Received the brace and was taken to Green Hills Care Center in Ames.

- Oct. 10: Returned home.

At Green Hills, I began therapy to strengthen my back muscles. The clam-shell brace is really correcting damage to my spine when I fell on my back six years ago. (My stirrups were too short that day, and I was in too much of a hurry to get off and lengthen them.) I have to wear the brace at least until mid-December. As an outpatient of the Green Hills therapy department, I am getting excellent water therapy in a swimming pool.

This past week I started to help with morning feeding of grain and hay in the barn. I can't do any heavy lifting, so I'm no good for stall cleaning and water buckets. All the horse owners at the barn are taking turns helping.

Magic's training is being continued with my friend, Tiffany Lauer at her Magistaad Stables in Pleasant Hill, Iowa. Magic and I will be rehearsing a lot of leg yielding.
